# **PARENTAGE : LF49-1902 x CO-290**

### HABITAT & GENERAL APPEARANCE

Slightly recumbent when young, becoming erect later. A free trashing variety. Flowers sparsely.

#### **LEAF**

- > **Blade** Erect canopy with thin leaves. Leaves green in colour.
- Sheath Light hairs present on the sheath with light wax coating. Greenish yellow with orange patches on the inside of the sheath.
- Auricle Well developed on both the sides of the sheath. Short and blunt; arises below the collar.
- > **Ligule** The shape of the ligule is horizontal.

# <u>STALK</u>

- Internode Medium thickness internodes. Yellowish in colour when exposed, turns greenish yellow on exposure. Shape of the internode is tomescent, medium hardness, light wax in the internode.
- Growth ring Greenish yellow in colour when unexposed, turns reddish/greenish on exposure. Swollen in nature.
- Root band Greenish yellow when unexposed, change to reddish on exposure. Root primordia are present in rows and are prominent. Root primordia are swollen with brown centres.
- **Bud** Round; arises above the sheath scar and below the growth ring. The germpore is at the apex.

## SUMMARY

A distinct feature of Galoa is the shape of the internode that is slightly swollen in the middle. Galoa is a mid season maturing variety recommended for planting on salt affected soils or saline soils. The best harvesting time for Galoa would be from start of August onwards.
